Vice President's Message (Sherry Woosley)

Mark your calendars – INAIR's 21st Annual Conference will be held on March 8-9, 2007 at French Lick Resort and Casino in French Lick, Indiana. The Executive Board has begun planning for the conference and we have a number of things to be excited about this year.

First, we're excited because Randy L. Swing, Ph.D. has agreed to be our keynote speaker. Dr. Swing is the Co-Director and Senior Scholar for the Policy Center on the First Year of College. He is not only a nationally known expert in assessment, but he is also passionate about using assessment as a means to an end (not an end in itself) and improving students' experiences through data-driven decisions. In addition to providing the keynote speech, Dr. Swing has also agreed to conduct a second session about assessment.

Second, an AIR BIRC grant is allowing us to provide new opportunities for INAIR members. As part of the grant, INAIR will be offering three awards for the INAIR 2007 conference: two Pre-Professional/New Professional Awards and one New Presenter Award. Specifically, graduate students and professionals with less than two years IR experience who submit poster presentations may apply for two Pre/New Professional Awards. Similarly, INAIR members who submit a presentation proposal for the 2007 conference and have not previously presented at an INAIR conference may apply for the New Presenter Award. Award winners will have their conference registration fees provided and receive recognition for their good work.

Third, we're looking forward to seeing the newly remodeled resort which has been highlighted in recent news stories about the grand re-opening. The INAIR Conference is always a great time to catch up with colleagues, make new connections, reflect on our work, and develop our skills and thinking. The French Lick Resort and Casino should provide a wonderful environment to do just that.
