CONFERENCE 2020 OVERVIEW

We would like to give our sincere thanks to the 125 individuals from 26 institutions across the state who attended the 34th annual INAIR Conference in Indianapolis in March! Our conference was successful in large part due to our membership, from those who conducted pre-conference workshops, to those who shared informative and engaging presentations on your work, to those who came eager to network and learn from your colleagues. Your conference planning committee appreciates all those who helped make our two days together in Indy a big success!

Thank you also to those of you who completed our post-conference survey. We learn so much from your thoughtful feedback. 51 individuals responded, 67% from public 4-year institutions, with 67% of respondents' primary area of responsibility noted as IR. 12 of our respondents enjoyed their very first INAIR conference, while 9 returned for at least their 10th conference!

Networking with other IR colleagues is the biggest takeaway from the survey results. The feedback from the survey will be used in planning the 2021 Annual Conference.

What did you like best? 35 of you took the time to tell us. A content analysis of the comments tells us that you most enjoyed/appreciated:

- Networking and interacting with your colleagues (18 mentions)
- Quality session content (15 mentions)
- Learning and hearing about new ideas (6 mentions)
- The location/meeting space (5 mentions)
- Smooth conference logistics and emails (5 mentions)
- The food (3 mentions)
- Preconference sessions (2 mentions)

What could be improved? 31 of you provided some great suggestions, with several mentioned more than once:

- Move conference to end of the week (4 mentions)
- Moving/reducing time of the business meeting (3 mentions)
- Consider a different hotel (2 mentions)

Congratulations to our very own Dr. Victor Borden for being awarded the 2020 Sidney Suslow Scholar Award.

This award is given annually at the AIR Forum to individuals "who have made significant contributions to the field of institutional research and has advanced understanding of the profession in a meaningful away." Dr. Borden joins a small group of highly esteemed scholars whose work has shaped our profession. Past recipients from the Hoosier state include Drs. Trudy Banta, Don Hossler, Gary Pike, and Rob Toutkoushian.

Beside the significant impact he has made through his scholarship and service, Vic has mentored countless individuals over the years. His kindness and willingness to

develop new professionals is invaluable to our field. A few of his former graduate students from the Post-Master's Certificate in Institutional Research (PMCIR) had this to say about their experiences:
