AIR Board of Directors Update

The AIR Board of Directors meets monthly to discuss member needs, activities led by the Board, and programs and initiatives led by the Executive Office. Since October 2022, the Board has also resumed twice-a-year in-person meetings. AIR offers various professional development options for both members and the broad IR community, including webinars, workshops, the IPEDS training center, and publications such as The AIR Professional File and EAIR. The AIR Hub

New Organizational Membership Option

In collaboration with the AIR Executive Office, the Board of Directors has approved a new *Organizational Membership* model, available to the public at the end of **January 2024**, to meet the needs of all higher education professionals. This new membership option will enable more individuals from the same institution to access AIR resources, promote data literacy across functional areas, and encourage collaborations among colleagues from different offices and fields. AIR Awards and Scholarships Open for Nomination and Application

Nominations and applications are open for several AIR awards and scholarships until **January 26, 2024**. For example, AIR provides current members three scholarship opportunities that facilitate the professional growth and development of early-career institutional research professionals: Julia M. Duckwall Scholarship Program, Edward Delaney Scholarship Program, and Jeff Seybert/National Higher Education Benchmarking Institute Scholarship Program. AIR also continues to recognize and celebrate individuals who have made extraordinary contributions to the association and the profession through the Outstanding Service Award and John Stecklein Distinguished Member Award.

In addition, a new award—**The AIR Rising Star Award**—will be offered to current AIR members in 2024. Unlike the other awards that celebrate long-term contributions, this award recognizes the achievements of IR professionals who are early in their careers and are emerging leaders.

Finally, AIR offers two awards that **do not require** current AIR membership—Sidney Suslow Scholar Award and Charles F. Elton Best Paper Award. Please see the <u>AIR website</u> for information on eligibility and the nomination/application process. Email <u>awards@airweb.org</u> with questions.

Voting for Volunteer Leaders Opens Monday, February 5, 2024

Each spring, AIR members vote for volunteer leaders on the Board of Directors and the Nominations and Elections Committee. Nominations for the open positions were closed on October 22, 2023. If you helped to identify exemplary candidates for AIR leadership roles, your effort is greatly appreciated. Open positions for the 2024 election include four Board of Directors Member-At-Large positions and two Nominations & Elections Committee member positions. As a reminder, the Board of Directors is the governing body of the Association. It acts as the membership's voice by soliciting member input and using it to make important decisions. The Nominations & Elections Committee (NEC) not only recruits members to serve as leaders, but also develops the call for nominees and reviews nominations to develop a balanced slate of candidates.

Amended Constitution and Bylaws

Between December 2021 and February 2022, the Board approved a series of motions that require updates to the Constitution and Bylaws. From January 17 to February 1, 2023, AIR members voted on <u>recommended language</u> <u>changes to the AIR Constitution and Bylaws</u>. The vote passed, resulting in amended <u>Constitution and Bylaws</u>. Please check the AIR in Motion website for details on the specific changes, the rationale, and the implementation timeline.

Under the leadership of Junelyn Pangan Peeples and in collaboration with the Executive Office, AIR updated its Ends Statement in May 2022 (updates highlighted in bold):

Updated AIR Ends Statement

AIR is a global association of higher education professionals. AIR exists to empower those individuals at all levels to use data, analytics, information, and evidence to make decisions that are effective, ethical, and equitable and take actions that benefit all students and institutions and improve higher education. This must be done within AIR's available resources and in such a manner that the value to higher education is worth the investment of those resources.

- A. AIR educates institutional researchers, higher education leaders, and professionals and organizations on the value of institutional research.
- B. AIR empowers and supports higher education professionals in:
- Contextualizing data across campus and throughout higher education;
- Learning methods and tools of the institutional research profession;
- Evaluating the effectiveness of institutions;
- Conducting research and scholarship.
- C. AIR provides opportunities for the development of professional and interpersonal skills.

AIR promotes the development of professional networks.
